



## Working in Partnership with Children and Families

“Who do I contact if I have concerns about my child?”

The first point of contact would be your child’s class teacher. If you have further concerns Mrs Kleban our SENCO is always available to give advice or you can arrange an appointment to speak to Ms Thornton Jones.

“How do you keep parents updated with their child’s progress?”

We hold two parent consultations, one in October and one in March where your child’s progress and details of their current levels and next steps will be discussed. We also send out a report at the end of the year.

Children with SEN have their targets and progress reviewed regularly with parents invited to attend additional meetings with the class teacher and Mrs Kleban (SENCO) or Mrs Butler (Learning Mentor).

“Do you offer open days?”

We offer taster mornings and afternoons for all our new nursery and reception children. We hold annual open evenings to aid transition to the next year group. Parents are welcome to drop in and meet their child’s new teacher and pick up an information pack about the new year group expectations.

“Do you have home/ school agreements.”

“What opportunities do you offer for children and parents to have their say?”

At Broadbent Fold we value the support and feedback from both children and parents. We have an active Pupil Leadership Team and conduct pupil voice activities throughout the year which influence what is taught through the creative curriculum and our themed weeks.

As well as our Parent Partnership meetings, we also hold termly Parent Forum meetings giving all our parents the opportunity to have a say. Parents may also wish to join our Governing Body or PTFA fundraising group.

“How can parents give feedback to the school?”
