<b>Literacy and Communication</b>	<p>In our Zoom lesson (Thursday) we will share Stig of the Dump.</p> <p>After the lesson complete <b>Stig comprehension questions</b> and then on another day complete <b>Stig agree, disagree sorting</b> activity. (These are based on the story)</p> <p>After reading, can children write what they think will happen next in the story? (share answers on Seesaw)</p> <p><u>Phonics</u>: revise and learn to read and spell these words.
