<b>Year 2</b>	<p><u>Theme:</u> Why was London burning?</p> <p><u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ We will be having our own campfire at Broadbent Fold and taking part</li> </ul>	<p>We will make some houses and show how quickly they burn and spread. We will then get into teams and see how much water the children can pass along with a bucket to rein act how buckets of water were passed from the Thames to the fire. We will also make</p>

<b>Year 3</b>	<p><u>Theme:</u> Could you survive the Stone Age? I'm a modern child...Get Me Out of Here!</p> <p><u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Making clay necklaces/pots</li> <li>✓ Outdoors being hunter gathers</li> </ul> <p><u>Texts:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Stone Age Boy,</li> <li>✓ Stig of the Dump by Clive King</li> </ul>	<p>Improve history knowledge and recognise how Stone Age people live. Compare the differences between Stone Age&lt; Bronze Age &amp; Iron Ages, describe 'hunter gathers' and learn about Skara Brae. Use modelled text to retell and write own stories based on Stone age boy.</p> <p>Improve DT knowledge with designing and making Stone age necklaces.</p> <p>Compare and group rocks based on their appearance and physical properties, giving reasons. Know how soil is made and how fossils are formed</p>
<b>Year 4</b>	<p><u>Theme:</u> Can you hear me from around the world?</p> <p><u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Homework project to create and deliver a creative presentation about a specific country</li> <li>✓ Text: 'Twas the Night Before Christmas by Clement Clarke Moor. Learn, recite and produce a video performance.</li> <li>✓ Polish Day- 10th November 2023</li> <li>✓ Anti- Bullying Week 13th November</li> <li>✓</li> </ul>	<p>This topic will give the opportunity to cover various key features of the Year 4 Geography and Science Curriculum. The children will: find out about how their ears work, how sound travels and how the telephone was invented and works. They will know the names of and locate at least eight major capital cities across the world. · Know where the equator, tropic of Cancer, Tropic of Capricorn and the Greenwich meridian are on a world map and learn about different Time Zones. The topic will encourage children to be empathetic global citizens when they explore what life is like for refugee children and those living in poor countries, compared to their own relatively safe, secure and comfortable homes in England. Learning and performing the traditional poem "Twas the Night Before Christmas" will serve to foster the children's love of poetry and performance.</p>

<p><b>Year 5</b></p>	<p><u>Theme:</u> Can you crack the code and become a spy?  Text: <i>Stormbreaker</i> by Anthony Horowitz  <i>The Spy's Secret Handbook</i> by Jane Penrose  <u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ A mysterious briefcase, a coded letter and clues are delivered to Year 5!</li> <li>✓ Spy Day! Dress up as the spies they have created. Activities include making identity cards with fingerprints, making gadgets, code breaking, spy moves and invisible writing!</li> <li>✓ Watch the film "Stormbreaker" and compare it to the book.</li> </ul>	<p>Using a quality text, and being immersed into their own spy missions with clues and code breaking, children will be inspired to write their own spy narratives. They will use their observations and clues from the mysterious briefcase to learn about different capital cities across the world, thus enhancing their geographical knowledge. Opportunities to make comparisons between a text and the genre of film, will help children to appreciate features of writing, and how these are transferred onto the screen.</p>
<p><b>Year 6</b></p>	<p><u>Theme:</u> Did we used to be Apes?  <u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Magistrates in the Community- 8th November</li> <li>✓ Evolution and Inheritance workshop- Tuesday 28th November</li> <li>✓ Class text- 'All about evolution' is a high-quality scientific text</li> <li>✓ Biographies- Charles Darwin</li> </ul>	<p>To find out about the role of magistrates and discuss common riles and laws- links to British Values- rules of law and PSHE- how to be a good role model  To enhance excitement about a new topic- show understanding of a new concept using literature. To research important historical figures and how they have changed our world. To develop reading for pleasure and skills of adventure writing. Cover all elements of the National Curriculum for the science strand on evolution and Inheritance. To use microscopes to look at real fossils; sort and classify them using the same skills as professional palaeontologists.</p>
