#### Topic

#### Literacy and Communication

Read the story **Somebody Swallowed Stanley** by Sarah Roberts using the pdf attached. Can you answer following questions:



- 1. Stanley was not an animal. What was he?
- 2. Can you remember any of the animals that swallowed Stanley?
- 3. What did the little boy make Stanley into at the end of the story?
- 4. How do you think Stanley ended up in the sea?
- 5. What could we do to stop more rubbish getting into the sea?

When you have read the story put the events of the story in order. You can choose a 1 star, 2 star or 3 star challenge.

Talk about how important it is to prevent plastic bags ending up in the ocean. Go to <a href="https://youtu.be/mjs66M41-04">https://youtu.be/mjs66M41-04</a> to watch the author, Sarah Roberts, explain what happens when plastic ends up in the oceans. One of the best ways to stop this is to reuse plastic bags in a variety of ways. Brainstorm ideas about different ways to reuse a plastic bag: reduce, reuse and recycle.

Create a poster to encourage people to recycle and reuse their plastic bags.

#### Maths and Problem Solving

Carry out the water pollution experiment described in the Rachel Carson's pdf.


