Answers

Clue 1 - It's a Grey Area

il- illegal illegible	im- immature impossible impatient	in- incorrect inactive	ir- irregular irrelevant
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The prefix with the most matching words is **im-**, so the ancient creature must have been **green**.

Clue 2 – Lettuce Investigate!

Apostrophes are needed for the following purposes:

To show singular possession

This book's pages are stuck together.

Each record's entry is over a page long.

To show plural possession

My discovery will certainly pique those scientists' interests.

The creatures' histories are so interesting.

Children's minds will be blown when they hear about this!

To show a contracted form

I can't believe we are so close to making discoveries.

Didn't you know that this beast existed?

We'll soon get to the bottom of these mysteries.

It'll be as clear as day soon.

You're not going to believe what we discover.

Apostrophes were used most often to show **a contracted form**, so the ancient creature must have been **an omnivore**.

Clue 3 – Eye I Can ~~Knot~~ Not Believe It!

The passage of text should read:

The **great** creature, **whose** name is the Paradise Werecat, **buries** its meal (usually **meat**) beneath the ground. **He'll** come back for it later. Their size depends on **whether** they are **male** or female but, fully **grown**, they have been **seen** up to 3m tall. They cannot be **missed**!

There were **10** spelling errors so the ancient creature must have lived on **land**.

Clue 4 - Judging by Its Cover(ing)

The prefix with the most matching words is **sub-**, so the ancient creature must have been covered with **scales**.

Clue 5 – Sizing up the Enemy

The results of the colouring should be as follows:

The most common word class is **adverbs** so the ancient creature must be between **200 and 300cm tall**.

The ancient beast who was slain by Saint George was the Thorny Changeling.
