Where will the magic take us?



<p>Go for a walk and look for a stick that would make a perfect magic wand. Maybe you could decorate it with paint or stickers when you get home. Can you make a magic spell with your wand?</p>	<p>Go on a winter walk with a grown-up and look around to see the things that have changed since the summer.</p>	<p>On winter mornings the ground often looks white with frost. Ask a grown-up to help you investigate the frost and find out what it is and where it comes from.</p>
<p>Design a scarf. You could draw it, paint it or even use other materials to make a collage. Can you create a repeating pattern?</p>	<p>A witch makes a magic spell. She puts 3 frogs in the cauldron and 3 spiders too. How many things are in the cauldron? You might like to make a drawing to show your answer.</p>	<p>Make a model castle. You could use cardboard boxes and tubes, building bricks or empty packaging. We would love to see your creating when it is finished!</p>
<p>Draw or paint a picture of a dragon. What colours can you use? What does your dragon look like? Can you tell a friend or grown-up about your dragon? Maybe you could give your dragon a name too.</p>	<p>During Chinese New Year celebrations, children are sometimes given envelopes with money inside! With an adult, look at some coins and see if you can see any numbers on them. What numbers can you see? What shape are the coins? What colours are they?</p>	<p>One of the colours often seen during Chinese New Year is red. Make a list of words that rhyme with the word red, e.g. bed.</p>
