



I wonder what you will find at the top of the beanstalk?

<p>Collect some natural materials, such as leaves, pebbles and sticks. Can you make a flower using the natural materials? You could take a photo to share with your friends. Can they guess which flower you created?</p>	<p>Explore outside and look at all the different plants that you can find. Make observations of the shape of the leaves and compare what is the same and different. Draw a picture of your favourite plant.</p>	<p>Help to plan and prepare a healthy meal that includes at least one type of bean. Then, practise using your cutlery to eat your tasty dish!</p>
<p>Imagine a giant beanstalk grew in your garden! Write a list of things you would like to find at the top of your beanstalk using your phonic knowledge.</p>	<p>The man from the story had 5 more magic beans. Some were red and some were yellow. How many different combinations of red and yellow beans can you think of that total 5?</p>	<p>Draw or paint a picture of some flowers. What colours do you need? Can you remember the different parts of a flower? Try using the words 'stem', 'leaves' and 'petals' to describe your flowers.</p>
<p>There are 10 seeds waiting to grow in a flowerpot. If 4 seeds start to grow, how many seeds would still be waiting to grow? You could use your fingers or draw a picture to help you.</p>	<p>Try growing some plants or flowers at home. You could try planting some seeds in a pot or in your garden. Remember to give your seeds some water and put them somewhere sunny. Cress seeds grow quite quickly or you could try planting some flowers.</p>	<p>'Sunflower' is a very long word for a very tall flower! What other words can you think of that start with 's'? Can you think of any words to do with flowers or the garden?</p>
