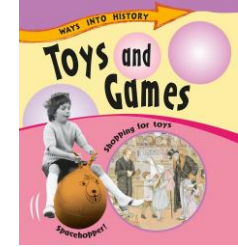


Tremendous Toys: Have you got this toy at home?
