Learning objective

To know the basic things animals including humans need to survive

Success criteria

I can name the 3 or more basics needed for survival I can say what happens if one or more of these is taken away I can identify these essentials in different environments

What does survival mean?

Dictionary definition - a state of surviving; remaining alive

There are many different habitats that animals and humans can survive in.

Animals usually have special features that help them to survive such as thick fur or are able to burrow deep into the ground.

Animals and humans have changed over time to adapt to the habitat they survive in.

Air



Oxygen is our most basic need.

The air has to be clean.

Humans and animals need this to survive.

Water



Other than the air we breathe, water is essential for survival.

It is estimated that a person cannot survive for more than 3-4 days without water.

Different animals need different amounts of water.

If there is no water a human or animal becomes ill because their organs stop working properly. They cannot survive.

Clean water is needed to keep a body healthy. Dirty water can lead to illness.

Food

If you have a good water supply the next essential need is food. Food gives bodies the energy to stay healthy and to be able to function properly.

A human or animal needs to move around to get shelter and or water and needs energy to do this.

Brains are also fuelled by food energy.

A body that does not have food can survive for quite a long time by using up fat reserves in the body.

Shelter

A shelter that helps to keep your body at a constant temperature is also a necessity. Without shelter a body is exposed to temperatures or weather that can be harmful.

This could be a place to rest or have babies for animals and humans.

A shelter should consist of a place to keep warm or cool as well as protection from the wind and rain.

A shelter can also act as protection from predators and without one an animal could be hunted.

This could also include appropriate clothing for humans as we do not have a covering of fur of feathers to protect our skin.

Task


Make a poster that shows the 5 basic things animals, including humans, need to survive.
