<b>Nursery</b>	<p><u>Theme:</u> I wonder what we will see in Autumn?</p> <p><u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Baking bread</li> <li>✓ Designing and making pizzas</li> </ul>	<p>All linked to real-life context of Autumn Enjoyment of stories - Communication and Language opportunities through the role play area and baking. Learning new skills associated to fine motor skills - Manipulation of materials</p>
<b>Reception</b>	<p><u>Theme:</u> I wonder what we will see in Autumn?</p> <p><u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Designing and making pizzas</li> <li>✓ Baking bread</li> </ul>	<p>Links to real-life context of autumn and the changing seasons. Enjoyment of stories - Little Red Hen Pupils have a purpose for writing linked to the story and the letters received from the Little Red Hen as well. There are also purposeful reading opportunities linked to the recipes from the story.</p>
<b>Year 1</b>	<p><u>Theme:</u> Where will your powers take you?</p> <p><u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ A crime scene involving the characters from 'Supertato'!</li> <li>✓ A Superhero Day</li> <li>✓ Visit from local firefighters (subject to availability)</li> </ul>	<p>Aspirations in the community and beyond. We will explore different jobs and why all they all have Superpowers. Celebration of local people. We will use our imagination and explore what a hero is to us. As part of our Superhero day, we will be: D&amp;T - Creating our own Supertato's to help us write our own story. Bring our learning to life; Dress up as Superhero's. Art: Create live Art, create a Captain America shield and our very own Superhero eye mask.</p>
<b>Year 2</b>	<p><u>Theme:</u> Is there anybody there?</p> <p><u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Space day</li> <li>✓ Making aliens</li> <li>✓ Science -space activities</li> </ul>	<p>Learn about the Sun and the Moon and the history of space. Share videos and books about space. Develop their awe and questioning. Show empathy for those that are not the same as themselves using Beegu as a text example. Investigate materials within science and in science week.</p>

<p><b>Year 3</b></p>	<p><u>Theme:</u> Where in the world will your ticket take you?  <u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Pretend flight around the world</li> <li>✓ Explore the work of LS Lory and Thomas Gainsborough</li> <li>✓ Learn about different festivals</li> <li>✓ Black History themed learning</li> </ul>	<p>Develop writing based on whole class text- A Ticket Around the World  Investigation and curiosity skills being developed through geography sessions.  Develop knowledge of European countries, English Cities  Use google maps to find places in the world.  Create different landscape pictures of places in the UK in the style of a famous artist</p>
<p><b>Year 4</b></p>	<p><u>Theme:</u> How did the Romans change Britain?  <u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Visit to the Grosvenor Museum in Chester for a Roman themed day</li> <li>✓ Roman invasion re-enactment on the school field</li> </ul>	<p>First-hand Roman experience  Full emersion into the topic to inspire writing and reading through historical content. Drama activities related to being a Roman Soldier to enable the children to visualise and understand history from first-hand experience.  Develop awe and wonder to inspire the future historians with our class read Boudica's Army (I Was There) and finding out about significant figures in history.</p>
<p><b>Year 5</b></p>	<p><u>Theme:</u> What was life like for Victorian children?  <u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Visit to George Street Chapel in Oldham in role as Victorian children</li> <li>✓ Role play opportunities in the classroom of poor children including miners and chimney sweeps and children from wealthy backgrounds.</li> </ul>	<p>Experience life as a Victorian child in a real context. This visit to a nearby Chapel will serve to develop the children's local knowledge of Victorian Britain and help them to use empathy for poor Victorian children. This will be embedded further by using quality texts such as Street Child and powerful BBC Radio's dramatisations of different jobs that children of the period were forced to undertake. The class will also learn about inventions that brought about significant changes to the Victorian way of life, some of which are still evident today (the telephone and railways).</p>
<p><b>Year 6</b></p>	<p><u>Theme:</u> What makes you unique?  <u>Hooks For Learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ How are you unique?</li> <li>✓ Class talent show</li> <li>✓ Crime through the ages</li> </ul>	<p>Quality texts: 'Can you see me now?' and 'Wonder'- look at neurodiversity and how people may be different Class Talent Show- the children will have the opportunity to share their talents, hobbies and skills.
