Here are some ideas:

Making themed homework:

- Make a Greek vase, research what a vase would look like
- Make a mask- Ancient Greek themed
- Make Greek coin
- Design and make a Greek temple
- Design a Labyrinth -it could be made of straws, string or wood!

OR

- Produce a non-chronological report about Ancient Greeks
- Draw a Ancient Greek person- what did they wear?
- Write a diary
- Create a Greek menu based on the foods eaten in Ancient Greek times

Ideally- bring this into school before 26th June.
