



Remote Learning/ Live Lessons

Monday 25th Jan – Friday 29th Jan

This week, children will have the opportunity to join the live lessons at school from home. Here is a step by step guide for how to schedule your learning and get the most out of this experience.

- 1. Before you begin your remote education, you should make sure that you have had your breakfast and are dressed for the day.
- 2. Prepare yourself a tall glass of water and have a pen and paper, and any other appropriate equipment you might need, ready.
- 3. Click on the zoom links at the allocated times to join the lesson and your class teacher will admit you to the lesson.
- 4. During the day we recommend that you take part in at least 3 lessons from different subject areas each day. Here is an example of what a timetable for your day might look like:

- 5. We recommend that you break your learning up into small chunks, with lots of time away from your computer screen. Use the learning grids provided by your teacher to guide your choice of lessons. Please build in time to exercise. Try to move around as much as possible, stretching your shoulder and neck muscles often. - 6. Lastly, make sure you are looking after yourself. Make sure that you have relaxation time and fresh air and we look forward to seeing you in the classroom from home.

	Weather or Climate? Ask children to discuss the difference between weather and climate. Share ideas as a whole class, drawing out that climate is the usual or average weather conditions over a long period of time, whereas weather is the specific meteorological conditions on a given day.
