Hooks for learning:

- ✓ Engage in an Anglo Saxon Day at school (weaving, baking, etc)
- ✓ Children become detectives to investigate the Sutton Hoo bodiless ship burial

- ✓ Compare and group materials based on their properties.
- ✓ Know and explain how a material dissolves to form a solution and demonstrate how some materials can be separated.
- ✓ Know and demonstrate that some changes are reversible, and some are not.

- ✓ Explore our PSHE theme of Relationships and how to recognise bullying and abuse, both in person and online.
- ✓ In RE, explore the question, "If God is everywhere, why go to a place of worship?" Discuss different religions.

- ✓ Study Shape, including Angles, Polygons and 3-D shapes.
