

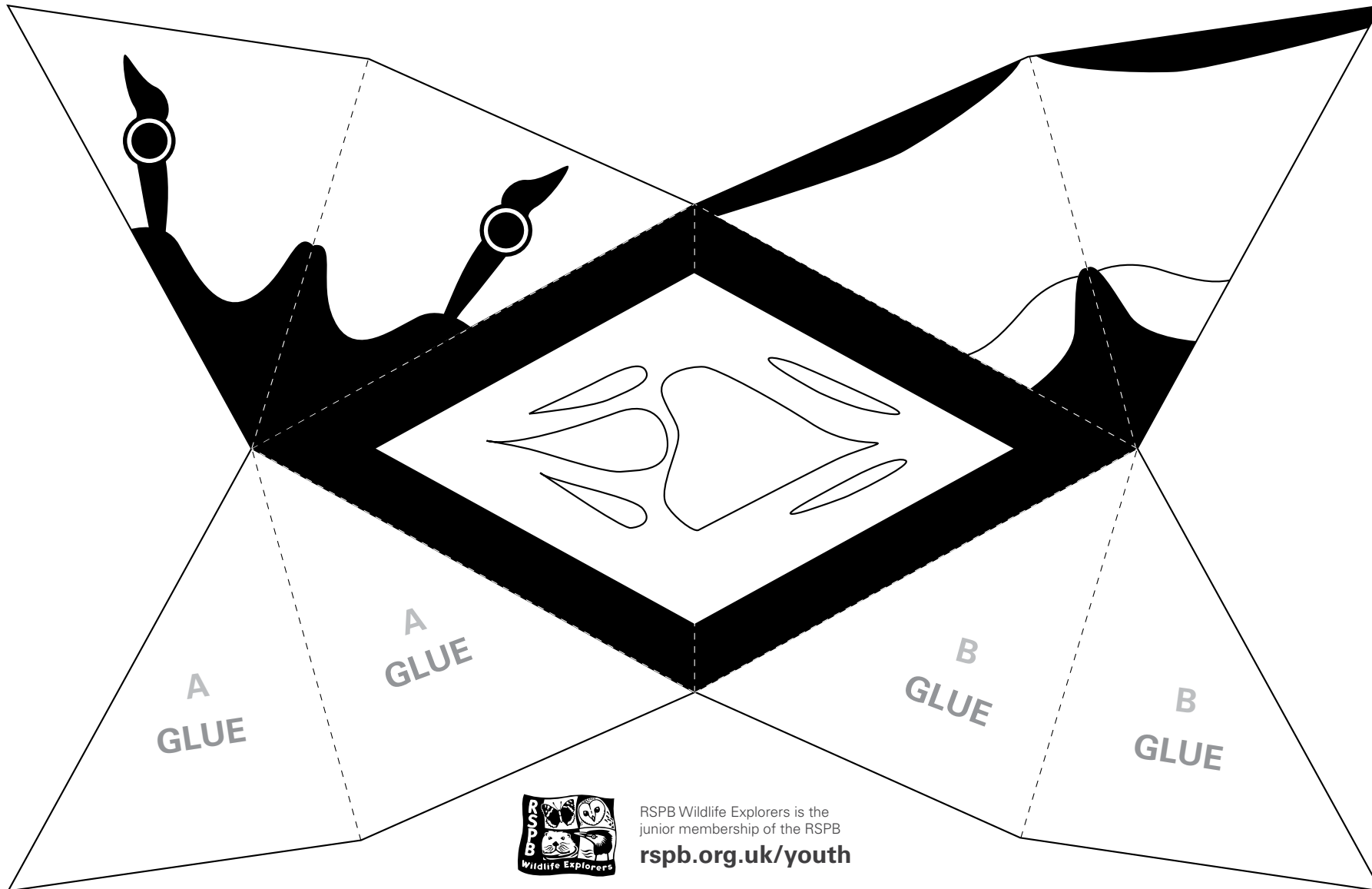
Collared dove snapper

You will need:

- Scissors
- Glue
- Light grey, dark grey and pink colouring pencils
- Double-sided tape.

What to do:

- 1** Colour the head light grey, and the two curved shapes under the beak dark grey. Colour the inside of the mouth pink. Leave the ring around the eye white.
- 2** Cut all around the outside of the collared dove snapper.
- 3** Fold the snapper along the dotted lines with the coloured area facing outwards. Make sure you fold across the middle of the mouth too.
- 4** Apply glue as marked. Match A and B glued sections under the head and beak, squeezing to stick in place.
- 5** Inside the top and bottom halves of the beak where circles are marked, stick a little piece of double-sided tape. Put your fingers on the tape and start snapping!
