







# Home Learning Year 1

<p><b>Topic</b></p>	<p>Would you be an Arctic explorer? Here are some ideas for you to complete at home whilst you are in lockdown this week.</p>	
<p><b>Literacy and Communication</b></p>	<p>Listen to the story 'Handa's Surprise'.</p> <p>Try as many of the different fruits in the story as possible. Write a sentence for each fruit you try using adjectives to describe it and a conjunction if you can. E.g. The pineapple is spikey but the mango is smooth.</p> <p>Think about what it looks like, the way it feels, the way it smells and the way it tastes.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you use a comma to separate two adjectives, e.g. The soft, yellow banana is delicious.</p>	<p>Compare the locations of where Handa and the penguin live using the conjunctions 'and' and 'but' to extend your sentences.</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around;">   </div> <p style="text-align: center; font-size: small;">She will be surprised, thought Handa as she set off for Akeyo's village.</p> 
<p><b>Maths and Problem Solving</b></p>	<p>Complete the White Rose Maths sheets on position (see attached).</p> <p>Make Ls with your fingers to help with your left and right = L for left.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  <p style="font-size: x-small;">ink saving Eco</p> </div>	<p>Create a treasure hunt for your child in your house/garden. Use positional language to guide them to the treasure (left, right, forward, backward, up, down).</p> <p>Get your child to hide something and direct someone in your family to it using the same positional language.</p>
<p><b>Science and the outside environment</b></p>	<p>Find out why exercise is so important and create a short exercise routine for you and your family (e.g. 10 jumping jacks, jogging on the spot for 30 seconds etc.).</p>
