Literacy and Communication	<p>Watch this clip of Toy Story where Woody meets Buzz Lightyear.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Q0bZEAuieR4</p> <p>Write some sentences to describe what the characters look like and how they are feeling when they first meet.</p> <p>What do you think is going to happen next?</p>	<p>Write about your favourite toy and explain why it is your favourite using 'because'.</p> <p>E.g. My favourite toy is my fluffy teddy bear because I like to cuddle it.</p> <p>Repeat this for the favourite toys of members of your family when they were children.</p>
Maths and Problem Solving	<p>Borrow lots of different coins from your Mummy or Daddy.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sort them into different colours • Sort them into different shapes • Sort them into different sizes • Can you order them from the least amount to the most amount? <p>Look at different notes. Are the notes worth more than the coins? Who is on the notes? What different colours are they? How much are they worth?</p> <p>Get your parent/carer to say a coin/note, e.g. 50p. How quickly can you find the right amount?</p>	<p>Complete the White Rose Maths sheets looking at identifying notes and coins.</p>
