- We will be using the story ***Somebody Swallowed Stanley*** by Sarah Roberts as inspiration for our stories.

Before we write or plan our stories we need to think of lots of ideas and then we can choose the best one!

Before we start generating ideas find a pencil and piece of paper to create mind maps as you move through each slide of the PowerPoint. You will also need your learning from yesterday's Literacy session.

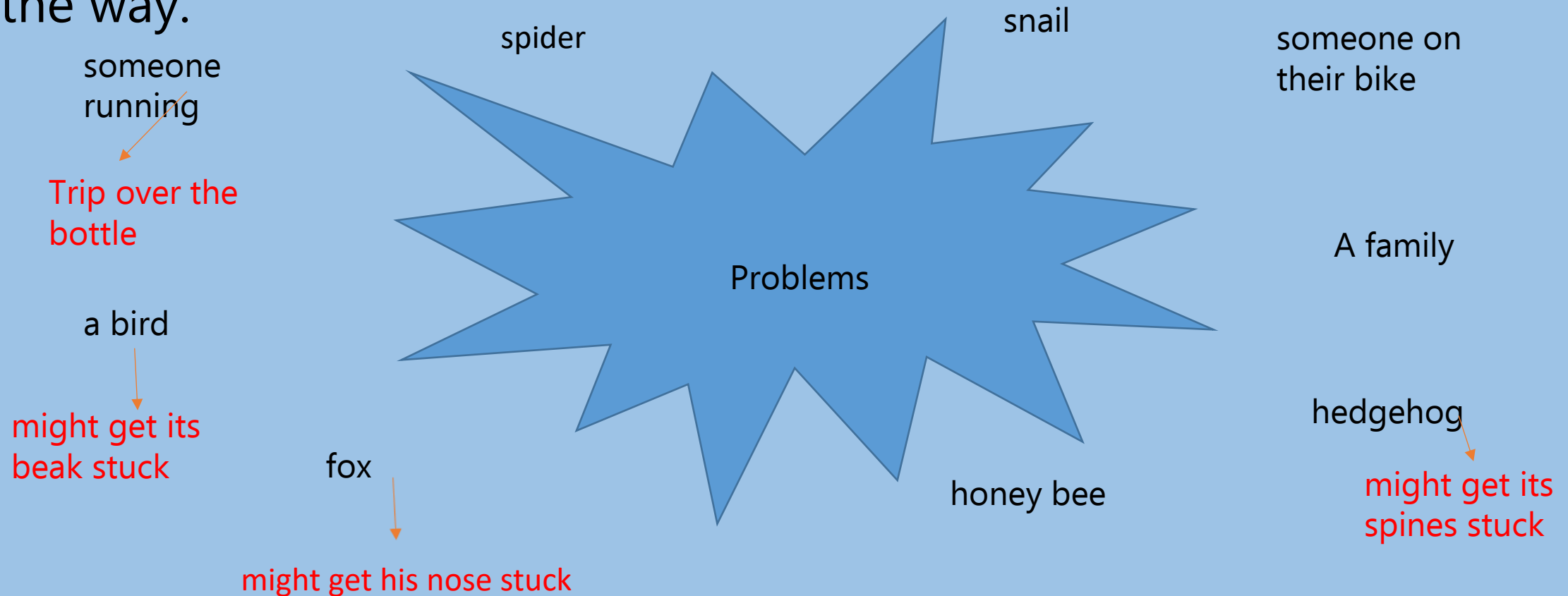
Yesterday you came up with a main character, a setting and other characters the main character might meet a long the way.

In ***Somebody Swallowed Stanley***, Stanley causes the characters he meets along his journey lots of problems.



Remind yourself of the main character and setting you chose yesterday. I chose a **plastic bottle** and the **woods**.

Remind yourself of the other characters he might meet a long the way. Now we need to think of the **problems** the main character might cause the other characters he might meet along the way.



We need to think of the resolution for the story so that people understand how important it is to recycle. In the story ***Somebody Swallowed Stanley***, Stanley gets saved by a boy and turned into a kite. This meant that the creatures were now safe from the plastic bag and people reading the book have learnt it is important to recycle!


You might have some ideas for your resolution from your recycling projects!
