
## Valentine's Day Wool Hearts

## You will need:

Split pins

- Stiff card 25cm x 25cm
- Red or pink wool
- Heart template (paper)
- A square of hessian or binca 20cm x 20cm
- · White glue
- Sticky tape



With string art, the opportunities are endless... start with this simple string heart and see where you can go from there!

## **Instructions:**

- 1. Place the template of the paper heart in the middle of your hessian on a flat surface and secure it down with sticky tape that you can remove later.
- 2. Stick the split pins through the hessian and secure them all the way around the edge of the heart. Remove the paper and you should have a heart shape made from split pins.
- 3. Now, glue your hessian to the card and leave it to dry. This traps the split pins in-between the hessian and the card so that you end up with a strong board where the pins are secure enough to wind wool around them.
- 4. Tie on one end of your wool to one of the pin heads and then, work around
- 5. Now, wind the wool around all the pins to fill in the middle of the heart. You can do this in an organised way or in a random fashion. Just make sure that you criss-cross the middle of the heart heart so that you finish with a red heart.
- 6. When you feel it is finished, tie off the end and snip off the rest of the wool. You may also want to put a blob of glue on the finishing end so that it doesn't come undone.

## Alternatives:

- Add a loop for hanging on a wall.
- Glue the hessian onto strong, folded card to make a greetings card.
- Add glitter glue to make it sparkle or thread on sequins or beads as you go.
- Use small tacks/nails in wood for the base to give a more natural feel
- Make a piece of art with the whole class by everyone making a small picture each.
- Use other coloured wool and other shapes or pictures for making string craft for other occasions, such as Easter, Mother's Day, Christmas, a wedding or party.
